



- The logo for Disney consists of Cinderella's castle with "Walt Disney Pictures" in front of the castle and a star flying across the castle. They even included balconies, windows, towers and a moat
- The typeface seen in "Walt Disney" is actually Walt Disney's signature
- The "D" in "Walt Disney" is Walt's signature
- In 1955, the original Disney logo went through a transformation and became the logo we see today
- After Walt's death, the typeface/signature changed because throughout the years different people wrote it
- In various movies, the background for the "Walt Disney Pictures" changes according to the movie
- The original logo for "Walt Disney Pictures" was Mickey Mouse's profile
- Walt chose to go in different style variations for his signature instead of sticking to one style when he created the "Walt Disney"
- The logo symbolizes and represents wonder, hope and magic
