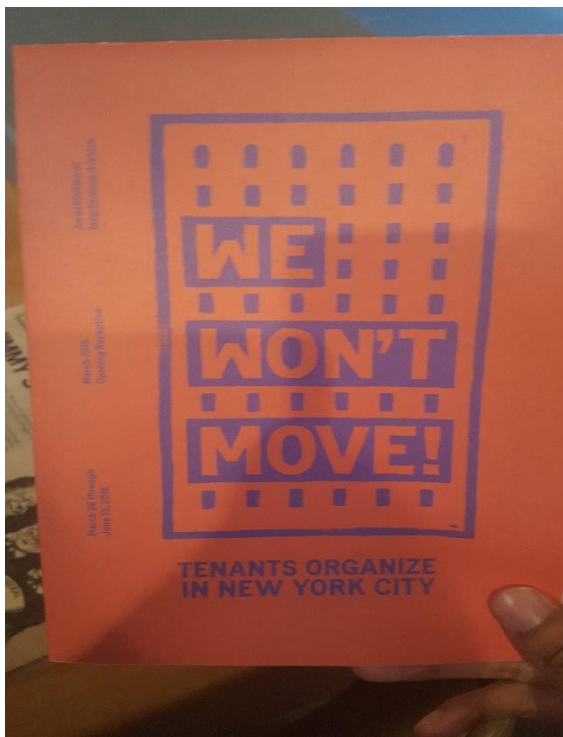

During our site visit, we met Mike Clemow who own a podcast radio station called "Radio Free". He talked to us about his journey making his podcast and developing his own radio station. When Mike began his first develop idea of podcasting, he was not sure if his idea was not going to be success due to the issues that he was having as seeing as pirate radio station. Due to that issue, he wasn't able to podcast 24/7 no more than 1 mile away around his area. During his podcasting, it took him a week to edit his podcast for sound effect and collect information.
