This is how your final grade will be calculated. There are a few changes, so be sure to read this carefully:

Attendance/Participation Before 3/12/20: <i>Being consistently present, on time, and engaging in class discussion; completing homework before class. <u>Four absences will be forgiven at the end of the semester.</u> After 3/12/20: <i>Responding to questions on the OpenLab website within 24 hours of a post. The questions will correspond with the dates/topics listed in the schedule. <u>No “absences” in this timeframe will be forgiven.</u></i></i>	20% 10 points possible for each session
Journal Assignments & Writing Reflections <i>This will be an ongoing assignment where you will be asked to answer questions about the readings we’re discussing or your own writing. I will be checking these responses, not to evaluate the contents, but to ensure that you’re keeping up with the assignments. There are seven Journal Assignments and three Writing Reflections. <u>One Journal Assignment “absence” will be forgiven; no “absences” for Writing Reflections.</u></i>	20% 100 points possible
Writing <i>There are three major writing projects due; one for each unit. You will receive 50 points for presenting a Rough Draft and up to 100 points for a Second Draft of each assignment. <u>If you miss a deadline, you’ll receive zero points for that assignment.</u></i>	30% 450 points possible
Writing Portfolio <i>This will be a significant revision of the three major writing projects, selections from your Journal, and a Final Reflection Essay, all of which will be a total of at least 6,000 words. <u>If you miss the deadline, you’ll receive zero points.</u></i>	30% 400 points
