

Editing Process

- Going through and organizing footage
- Reading the script and getting familiar with the storyline
- Making bins for each day of footage
- Create proxies for each shoot day to help edit faster
- Made individual sequences for each day/scene to sync audio
- Made the main sequence where everything came together
- Started the actual edit
- Looked for non copyrighted songs to use as part of the soundtrack for the film (with / without vocals)
- Green Screen and Color Grading was done by Ketak but I was there to look on to the process



Challenges

- Communication/Scheduling conflicts between me and Ketak
- Cancellations / change of shoot days and actors scedhules
- Delay of receiving footage / audio
- Proxies taking a long time to download
- Switching desktops with proxies
- Very Late nights / all nighters
