

# Creating Bibliographic Entries for Your RAB (MLA Format)

Here's a guide for creating the bibliographic entries for a number of source types using MLA formatting guidelines. Keep in mind that you are welcome to use websites such as Easybib and Citation Machine. However, these tools do not always—in fact, frequently do not—produce flawless results, and it will be your responsibility to double check that citations generated by websites such as these are accurate and formatted correctly.

## 1. Peer-Reviewed Academic Article:

Author(s). "Title of the Article." *Title of the Journal*, vol. Volume Number, no. Issue Number, Year, page numbers. Database.

Smith, John. "The Impact of Climate Change on Biodiversity." *Environmental Science Journal*, vol. 45, no. 3, 2020, pp. 234-256. JSTOR.

Miller, Emma, and David Wilson. "Innovations in Renewable Energy." *Sustainable Technology Review*, vol. 30, no. 2, 2022, pp. 123-138.

Anderson, Sarah J., et al. "The Impact of Artificial Intelligence on Modern Medicine." *Medical Advances and Innovations*, vol. 14, no. 3, 2021, pp. 57-72.

## 2. Online Articles (Non-Academic):

Author(s). "Title of the Article." *Title of the Publication*, Date of Publication, URL.

Johnson, Mary. "New Study Reveals Alarming Increase in Cyberbullying Cases." *The Daily Gazette*, 15 June 2022, [www.dailygazette.com/cyberbullying-increase](http://www.dailygazette.com/cyberbullying-increase).

## 3. Website:

Author(s) or Organization Name. "Title of the Webpage." *Title of the Website*, Date of Publication or Update, URL.

National Aeronautics and Space Administration. "Mars Exploration Program." *NASA*, 10 July 2023, [www.nasa.gov/mars-exploration](http://www.nasa.gov/mars-exploration).

## 4. Online Video:

Uploader's Name. "Title of the Video." *Website Name*, Publication Date, URL.

Smith, Emma. "How to Cook the Perfect Omelette." *YouTube*, 25 May 2029, [www.youtube.com/watch?v=abcdef12345](http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=abcdef12345).

## 5. Podcast:

Host(s). "Title of the Episode." *Title of the Podcast*, Episode Number (if available), Date of Publication, URL (if applicable).

Example: Doe, Jane, and Smith, John. "The Science of Artificial Intelligence." *Science Today Podcast*, episode 56, 5 April 2021, [www.sciencetoday.com/podcast/56](http://www.sciencetoday.com/podcast/56).

**6. Documentary Film:**

Director(s). *Title of the Film*. Distributor, Year of Release. Format.

Smith, John, director. *The Climate Crisis: Unveiling the Truth*. Environmental Films, 2020. Film.

**7. Book:**

Author's Last Name, First Name. *Title of the Book*. Publisher, Year of Publication.

Smith, John. *Climate Change and Its Effects on Our World*. Environmental Publishing, 2019.
