(Linking Employment, Academics & Disability Services)


The CUNY LEADS Program, which is a program linked to the New York City College of Technology, intends to help college students, whether with disabilities, during their job hunting and prepare them for the work world. The office that occupies a prominent and equipped space is the central place of this public project, which targets primarily college students. The assistance disabled persons and other students get here is not attributed to their identification. They are all considered, and the assistance is given uniformly. One of the significant value additions of CUNY LEADS to a student's college life is through the employment readiness efforts that the program initiates. The program activities give the students a lot of early practical exposure in the professional field.

Each CUNY Campus has a CUNY LEADS Advisor, I worked closely with City Tech's, Linda Rivera, MSED.






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

Cost

This exciting program is Free for all eligible CUNY students

Services

- Academic Advising and Goal Setting for Major/Career Choice, or Transition to a 4 year school
- Career Counseling, Exploration and Development
- Job Search Skills and Assistance Including: Resume and Cover Letter Review and Editing, Mock Interviewing, Interview Follow Up, and Soft Skills Training
- Internship Exploration
- Referrals for Tutoring, Scholastic and Health Service Supports
- Counseling Regarding ADA/504 Modifications and Disclosure
- · Self Advocacy Skills

Student Responsibility

- Students must submit medical, educational or psychological documentation regarding their disabilities or medical conditions.
- While it is preferred that the student is registered with the Center for Student Accessibility, it is not required for participation in CUNY LEADS.
 However, the student must present documentation of disability to the LEADS Advisor. All documents & information will be kept confidential

- Students must have a realistic career goal
- Students are responsible for completing the appropriate documentation to determine eligibility for the program as provided by the LEADS Advisor
- Students must meet with the advisor on and ongoing basis

LEADS is available on all CUNY campuses. Each campus has a LEADS counselor who collaborates with campus departments, agencies, and businesses to provide career guidance and support to students.

Services

- Academic Advising and Goal Setting for Major/Career Choice, or Transition to a 4-year school.
- Career Counseling, Exploration and Development.
- Job Search Skills and Assistance Including Resume and Cover Letter, Review and Editing, Mock Interviewing, Interview Follow-Up, and Soft Skills Training.
- Internship Exploration.

- Counseling Regarding ADA and Self Disclosure of both the workplace and college setting.
- · Self-Advocacy Skills.
- Students must submit medical, educational, or psychological documentation regarding their disabilities or medical conditions.

Requirements

- While it is preferred that the student is registered with the Center of Student Accessibility is not required for participation in CUNY LEADS. However, the student must present documentation of disability to the LEADS Advisor. All documents & information will be kept confidential.
- Students must have a career goal.\(\text{\pi} \)
- Students are responsible for completing the appropriate documentation to determine eligibility for the program as provided by the LEADS Advisor.
- Students are expected to meet with the advisor on an ongoing basis.


