Exekias, amphora with *Achilles and Ajax Playing Game of Dice*, c. 540-530 BC

**Classical (c. 450-400 BC)**

Polykleitos, *Doryphoros (Spear Bearer)*, c. 450-440 BC

Myron, *Diskobolos (Discus Thrower)*, c. 450 BC

*Riace Warrior*, c. 450 BC

Iktinos and Kallikrates, Parthenon, on the Acropolis, Athens, Greece, 447-438 BC

- East pediment of the Parthenon (Elgin marbles, British Museum) including 3 Seated Goddesses
- Lapith and Centaur, metope on south side of Parthenon
- Frieze of Panathenaic Festival

**Late Classical (c. 400-323 BC)**

Praxiteles, *Aphrodite of Knidos*, c. 350-340 BC

Lysippos, *Apoxyomenos (Athlete using Strigil)*, c. 330 BC

**Hellenistic Period (323-31 BC)**

*Winged Nike (Winged Victory)*, from Samothrace, c.190 BC

*Laocoön and His Two Sons*, 1<sup>st</sup> century AD
