Names and terms to know:

interlace logo manuscript illuminated manuscript Bible, comprised of the Four Gospels, written by the Four Evangelists (John, Mark, Matthew, Luke) scribe illuminator monastery, monastic community vellum pilgrimage relic, reliquary embroidery latin-cross shape church Bayeaux Tapestry: William the Conqueror and the Norman invasion of England Abbot Suger of Saint Denis

Architectural terms to know: barrel (tunnel) vault, nave, aisle, apse, church portal, tympanum, round arch vs. pointed arch, rib vault, radiating chapels, ambulatory, flying buttress, stained glass, rose window, jamb statues

Important Christian narratives: Crucifixion, Last Judgment, Lamentation
