To complete the **2021-2022 FAFSA** (For Summer 2021, Fall 2021 & Spring 2022) you can go to https://studentaid.ed.gov/sa/fafsa. You will need the following to complete your application:

- Your 2019 income / federal tax returns (If you worked and/or filed taxes in 2019)**
- Your Parent (s) 2019 income / federal tax returns, if you are dependent.**
- Your FSA ID and Password. (If you are dependent, you will need your Parent's FSA ID and Password as well)
- City Tech's FAFSA School Code: 002696

It is advised that you use the **IRS Data Retrieval Tool. IRS Data Retrieval Tool allows applicants and/or parent (s) who have already filed their federal income tax returns to prefill the answers to some questions on the FAFSA by transferring data from their federal income tax returns. This can save you some time in completing the FAFSA. To learn how please visit https://studentaid.gov/resources/irs-drt-text.

After you submit your FAFSA you must complete your 2021-2022 TAP Application. Do not log out of the FAFSA. Click on the "Start your state application" link on the online FAFSA confirmation page to complete your TAP application after submitting the FAFSA. If you are not able to, within 2-3 business days you can complete the 2021-2022 TAP Application at https://www.tap.hesc.ny.gov/totw/. You will need the following to complete your application:

- Your 2019 income / New York State tax returns (if you worked and/or filed taxes in 2019.
- Your Parent(s) 2019 income / New York State tax returns, if you are dependent.
- Your HESC Username and PIN.
- Your Parent (s) NYS Driver's or Non-Driver's ID #. This number will be their e-signature. (if dependent)
- City Tech's TAP School Code: 1405

If you are not able to complete the 2021-2022 FAFSA and TAP Applications due to your immigration status, you may qualify for TAP through the <u>Jose Peralta New York State Dream Act</u>. If you have not completed the NYS Dream Act please visit https://www.hesc.ny.gov/dream/. If you do not have an immigration status it is advised that you do not complete the FAFSA Application.
