We will be continuing with Culture as a departure for Project.

If Art, design and architecture are a reflection of culture then using culture as a basis of exploration is valid. Our goal is to examine for each of us who we are and what our own cultural backgrounds can provide as design drivers and potentially lead to greater understanding of self. What does it mean to be a designer in the 21st century with the cultural background you possess or identify with will be one of the goals of this exercise?

Step 1. What culture do you identify with or claim lineage?

Define what your culture is, where its origins lie and what can you teach us about your culture. What is the language, specific art, vernacular architecture, food, traditions, music, clothing etc. that define your culture.

Research and create 11x17 panels that define your culture for education of your colleagues in class.

For Friday's class

You will present your research that answers all of these questions and others that you find relevant on 11x17 landscape pages. You can make as many pages as you like. Be clear as to the headings of each exploration as well as in the graphic layout. Language is a large part of culture therefore there is an expectation that use of language from a cultural standpoint has importance.
