Ms. Zhao is a medical laboratory scientist at Mount Sinai St. Luke's Hospital Center. She was recently appointed an American Society for Clinical Pathology (ASCP) Career Ambassador. ASCP is a professional medical society representing the pathologists and certified laboratory professionals who are responsible for collecting and analyzing human cells, tissues, and fluids in order to detect the onset or progression of disease.

Ms. Zhao initially began her journey as Biochemistry major in SUNY Stony Brook in 2007, a path similar to that most pre-medical students take. She was accepted to the clinical laboratory sciences program after being introduced to it by a friend. She enjoys speaking to science students about careers in medical laboratory science and the hands-on experiences and clinical studies that this field has offered her. She has accepted a job at Mt. Sinai St. Luke's hospital as a general medical technologist – working in the fields of hematology, chemistry, serology, and molecular diagnostics.
