## Professional Development Center/ Lunch With A Leader

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On Monday, November 18th, 2019 Mendez attended a Professional Development Workshop from 11:30 pm to 1:30 pm. Mendez had the privilege to sit down in a professional environment and have lunch with a leader. In this workshop, students have the ability to dress to impress and be ready to meet entrepreneurs. The speaker for this event was an entrepreneur named Fernando Ramirez. Everybody has the chance to have a delicious three-course meal while listening to Ramirez's story. Ramirez is an entertainment attorney who provides transaction legal services for clients in the music, film, television, and book publishing industries. Ramirez got the chance to work as an entertainment attorney for 18 years. Just alone in the film and television industry, Ramirez served as a legal counsel on over 85 films. Ramirez stated that being in this industry and having a career as an Entertainment Attorney can be a lot of fun but very stressful at the same. Ramirez pointed out the pros and the cons of his career, and what could have been different if he had a mentor throughout his college career.

This workshop was offered through the Professional Development Center at The City
University of New York, CUNY, New York City Colege of Technology to prepare students for
future careers and to get first-hand advice from professionals who have worked in their field for

to the negatives. Ramirez comes from being an undergrad at Fordham University and obtaining a
Law degree from Brooklyn Law. Ramirez stated how throughout his undergrad and grad years

His advice to students was having a mentor can really work in your favor.

Ramirez explains by having a mentor lead you throughout your college career is essential because it gives you the opportunity to learn from somebody who has experience and is able to advise you when you do not know what to do in certain circumstances. He assures that if he was privileged enough to go to an Ivy League university such as Harvard, he would have got the mentorship. He gave a quick story where he was fortunate enough to meet somebody big in the music industry in one of his son's field trip who wanted to seek help from him.
