- The show and the collection had marked the end of a successful year for Dior.

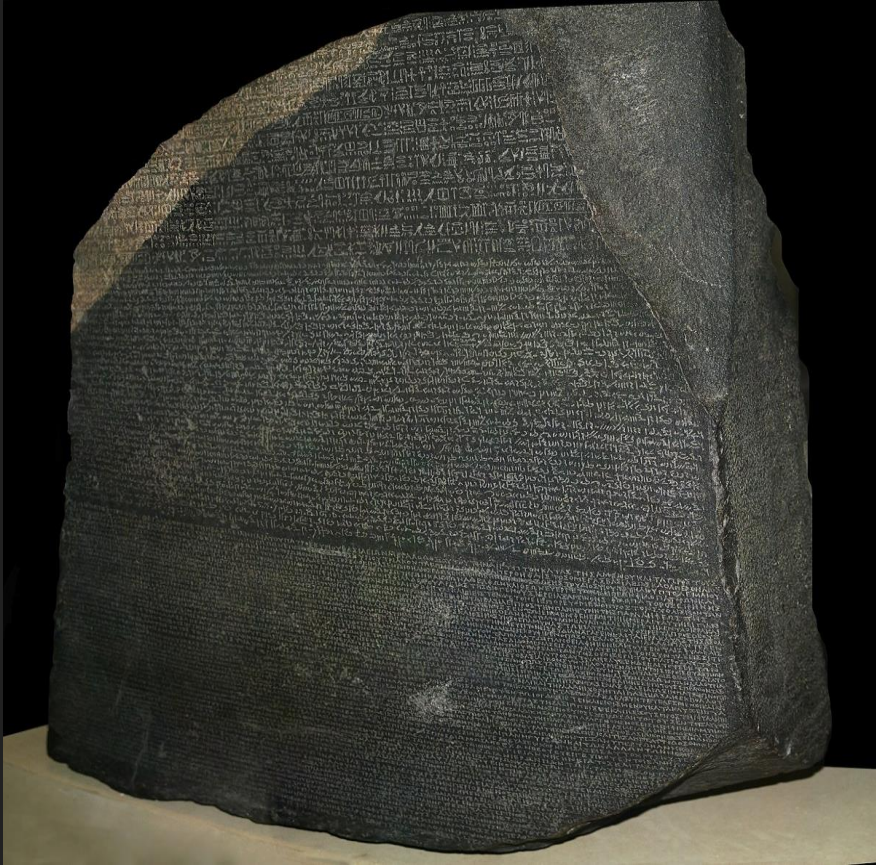
Current Article: Egyptians call British Museum to return the Rosetta stone

- Many Egyptian citizens have called for the return of an ancient historic artifact called the Rosetta stone.
- According to (Monica Hanna 2022) dean of the Arab Academy for Science, Technology & Maritime Transport, and organiser of one of two petitions calling for the stone's return. "The British Museum's holding of the stone is a symbol of Western cultural violence against Egypt,"
- Claims from Hanna's petition included accusations that the stone is a "spoil of war" including information that Egypt was forced to hand over the Rosetta stone during their 1801 treaty.
- What is the Rosetta stone?
- The Rosetta Stone is a large stone slab with inscriptions on it in three different writing systems. The stone is written in hieroglyphics, which was the script used for writing in ancient Egypt, as well as in Greek and Egyptian Demotic.

Counterclaim from the British Museum

- “In a statement, the British Museum said the 1801 treaty included the signature of an Ottoman admiral who fought alongside the British against the French, arguing that he represented Egypt as the Ottoman sultan nominally ruled Egypt at the time of Napoleon’s invasion.”
- The British Museum claims that the treaty was signed by the current admiral of the time and has established rightful claim to the Rosetta stone.
- Also claiming that the Egyptian government itself has not submitted a request for the return of the stone. Rightfully so, the museum does not need to return until such request is upon them.

What is the Rosetta Stone?

The Rosetta Stone is a large block of basalt, an ancient Egyptian hieroglyphic stela, the only surviving fragment of a larger stone that bears inscriptions in three forms: hieroglyphs, Demotic, and Greek.

As the only known example of hieroglyphs, Demotic and Greek inscriptions, the Rosetta Stone was used by the British to decipher the hieroglyphs. It was discovered in 1799 by British soldiers in the town of Rosetta, Egypt.

1. Egyptian pyramids were not built by slaves, by laborers, who were fed and treated well.
1. Mount Sinai, located in the Sinai Peninsula, is the mountain Moses climbed, in the 10 commandments, in the holy bible. The mountain is sacred in both Christian and Islamic religions. This site stands at 2,285 meters (7,497 feet) high.
1. Contemporary Egyptian in Christianity and Islam are are monotheistic, but Ancient Egyptians were polytheistic. They believed in more than one god, including gods from other civilizations, and countries.
1. Toothpaste and tooth powder was created by the Ancient Egyptians.
1. Cairo is the largest African, and Middle Eastern city. The city is approximately 500 square km. An estimated population of 22 million, Cairo is one of the most populated cities in the world.

6. The most popular sport in Egypt is soccer (football).

7. The Pyramids of Giza are not the biggest pyramids of the world. The biggest pyramid in the world is located in Mexico. The Great Pyramid of Cholula, a man made pyramid, measures 450m by 450m at its base, resulting in it being twice as big as one pyramid in Egypt.

8. Facebook is very popular in Egypt. There are approximately five million Facebook users in Egypt, more than any other Middle Eastern country.

9. Social media accounts with more than 5000 followers, are subject to the country's media laws, and can be monitored by authorities, and must be licensed by the government.

10. The 365 day calendar, that is divided into 12 months, was invented in Egypt.
