ENG 1101 ESSAY #2 Thinking Critically About Your Major/Career

Note: This is not an in-class essay

In class, we've discussed and read several essays that consider the stress that arises when transitioning into college and the importance of developing aspects of emotional intelligence to better navigate life, college, and your future career. We've also discussed the financial benefits of earning a college degree despite the possible criticisms. Using SIGI³, you have done your own research about you career interests, taking into account financial considerations, finding personal meaning in work, having a sense of control over environment, having adequate vacation time, having an outlet for creative voice or expression, and/or doing work that makes you feel more connected to larger society through service.

THE WRITING TASK:

Write an essay that considers one college major **or** career option you are considering and how a college education will help you or others interested in this career. To support this, consider how a specific major or career will help students fulfill personal goals, professional goals, and/or affect society in the future

For this essay you must:

- Write a thesis that identifies the career option you are considering and how a specific major (whether you are currently in that major or not) will help you succeed
- Integrate one of your responses to Activities 1, 8, and 12 in the Companion for the First Year at City Tech.
- Integrate the results you get from your SIGI assessment, to identify your own strengths and how these relate to the major or career you are focusing on throughout this essay.
- Integrate a reference to the article by Danielle Douglas-Gabriel

LENGTH REQUIREMENT:

A well-written 2 1/4 page paper might qualify for a C.

A well-written 2 3/4 page paper might qualify for a B.

A well-written 3 1/4 page paper might qualify for an A.

Papers less than 2 pages will not pass.
