


Where is South Sudan?



It's located in East-Central Africa.






When did South Sudan gain its independence? South Sudan gained its independence from Sudan on July 9th, 2011.




What is the capital of South Sudan?




The capital of South Sudan is currently known as Juba.


I say "currently" because there have been talks of moving the capital to the city of Ramciel.








What do the colors of the South Sudanese flag mean?




The colors of the flag are to represent:


- Black: Black African skin.

There's no real name for what they have on, but this is what is worn during festivals.













What do South Sudanese people like to eat?

93% of the so-called privately owned houses in South Sudan are made of grass-thatched or mud huts, popularly known




as tukuls.
