Beyond the Rabbit Hole: The Photographs of Charles Lutwidge Dodgson aka Lewis Carroll

- Read a review by the art critic Michael Kimmelman of the New York
  Times. The review discusses a 2003 exhibit of Dodgson's photographs
  at the International Center of Photography (ICP)

Kimmelman summarizes the controversies over Dodgson's photography and reveals the attempt to recover these photographs via the social-historical context of Victorian culture. In a 500-word essay critique Kimmelman's review in relation to the web exhibition.
