Four officers arrived at the scene and one of the four officers handcuffed Floyd and kept his knee on Floyd's neck for 8 minutes and 46 seconds. The knee was not removed even after he lost consciousness. His heart stopped beating shortly after. This event reignited the Black Lives Matter movement which is a movement designed to oppose racism and anti-black violence such as police brutality. BLM made its first appearance around 2013 following the death of a black teenager named Trayvon Martin. A teenager who was shot and killed after walking home from a trip to the convenience store by George Zimmerman. In 2014, the death of Micheal Brown made Black


