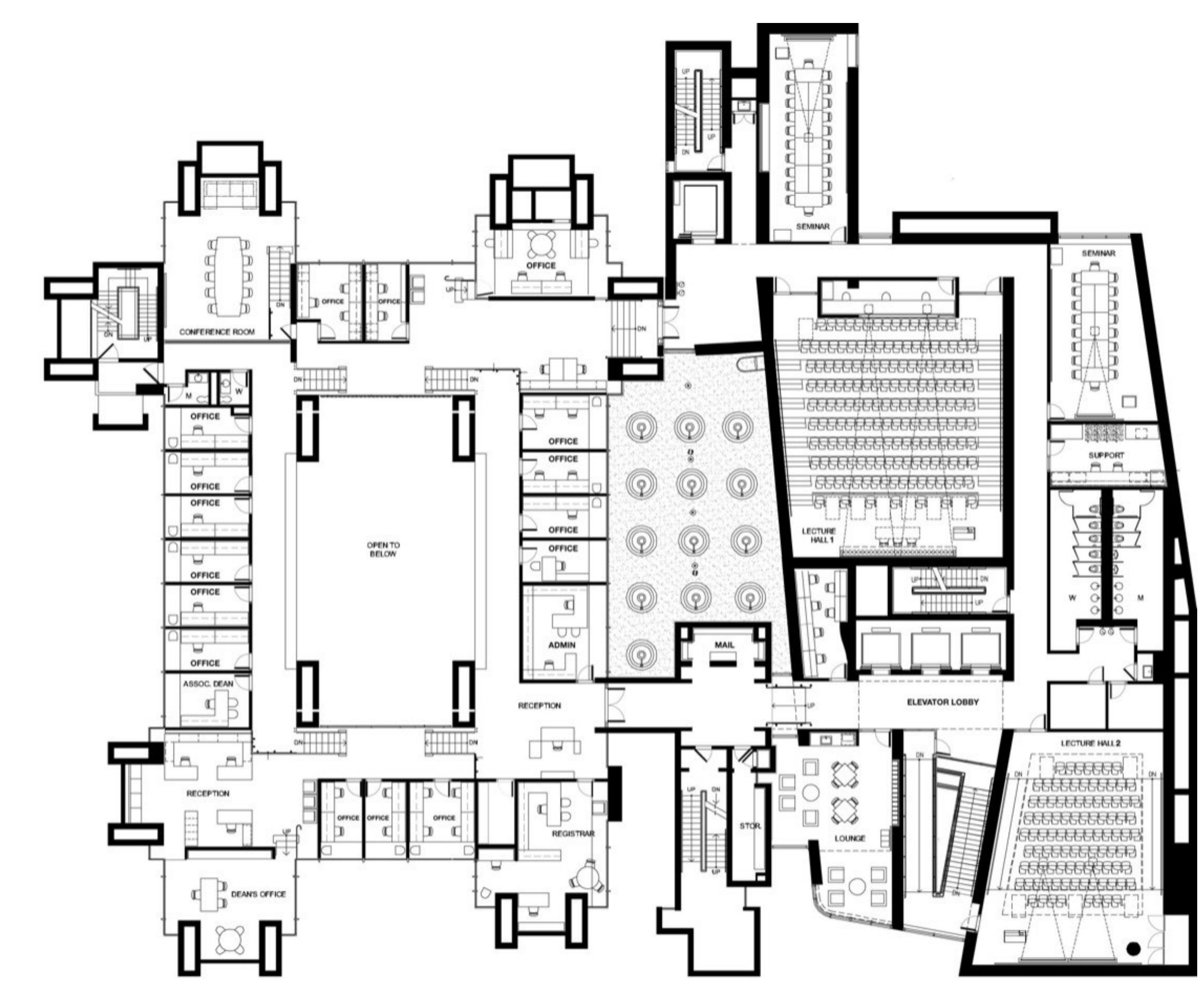
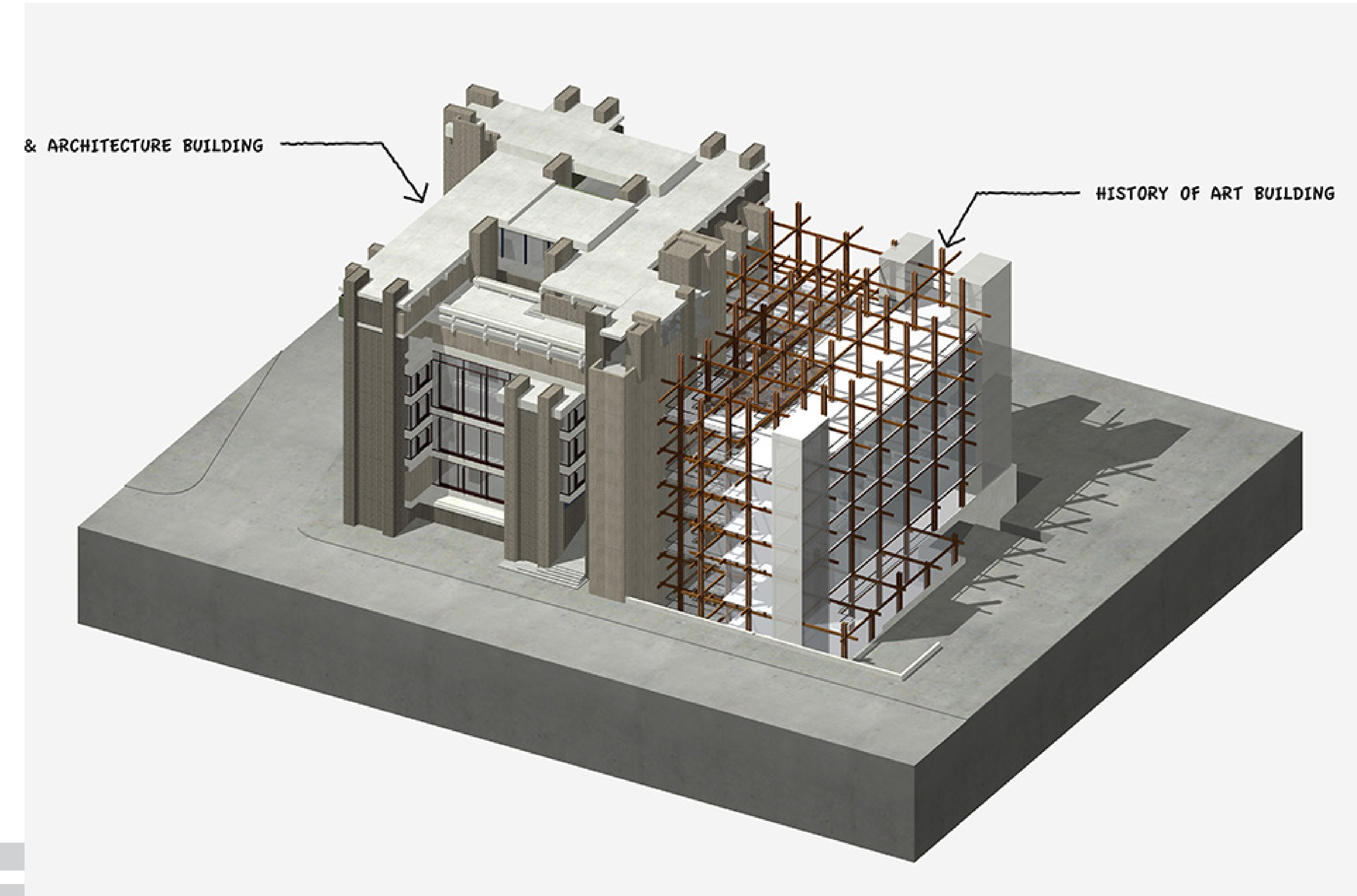
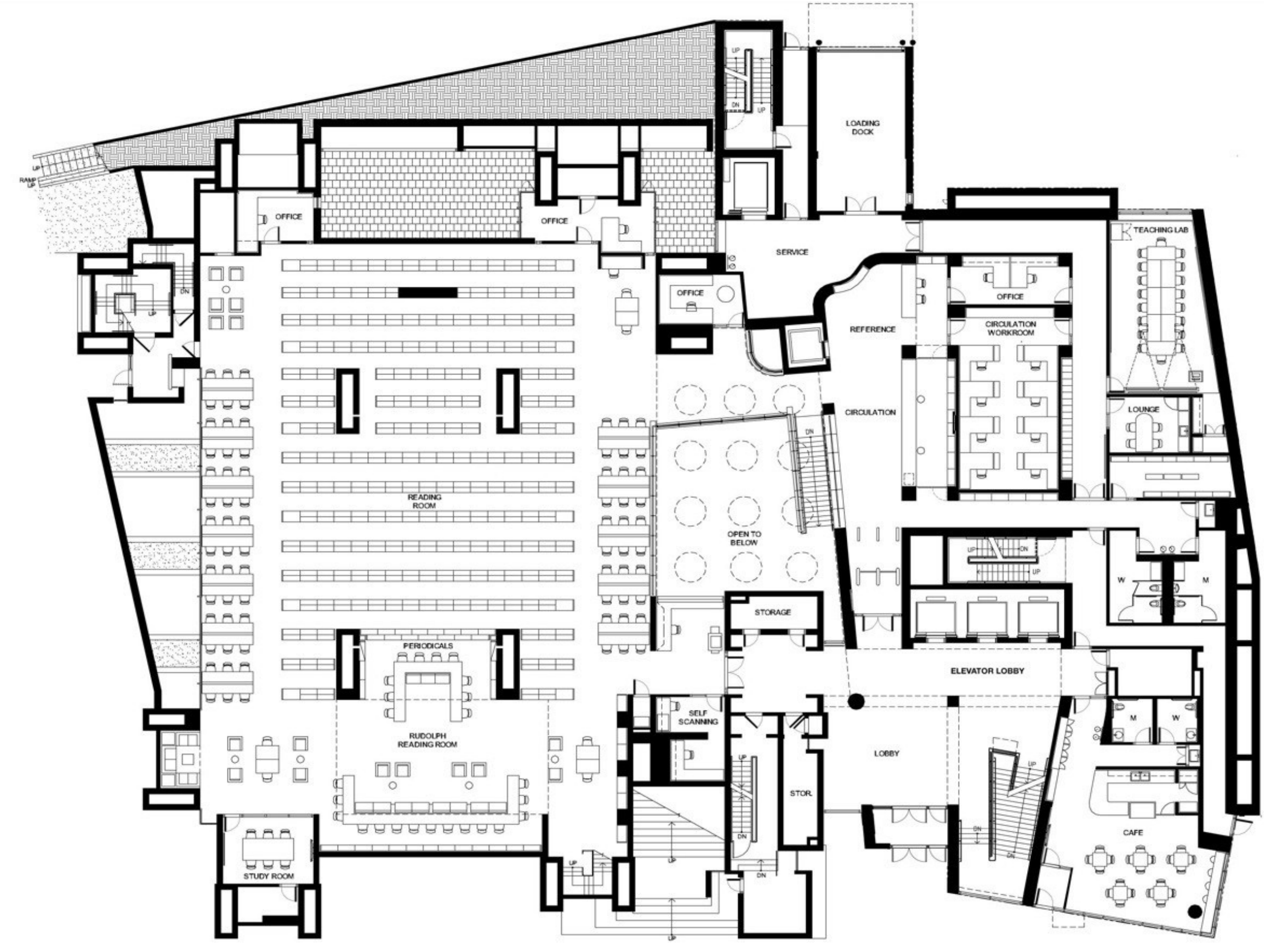
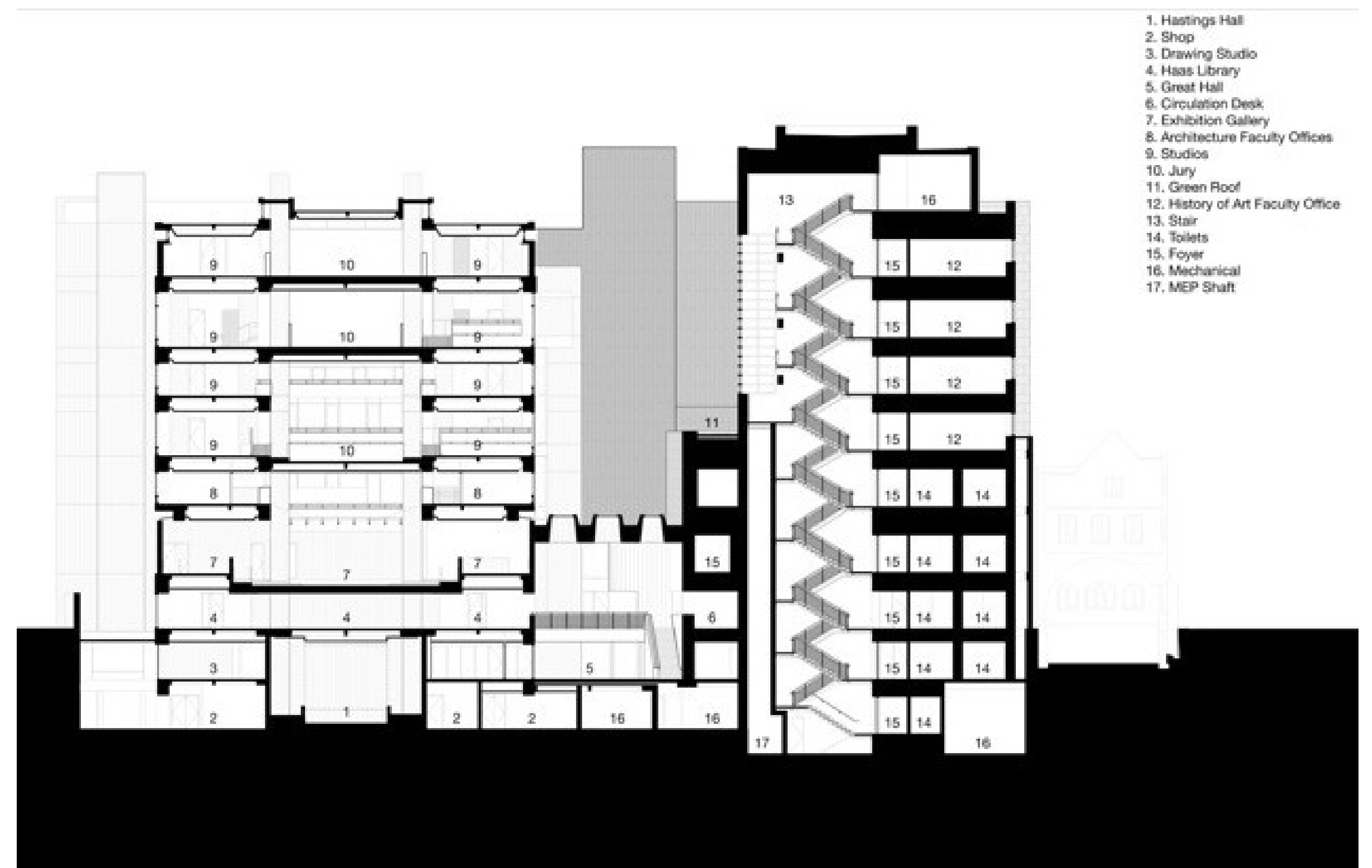


Paul Rudolph – Yale Art and Architecture Building



The Yale Art and Architecture Building was design by Paul Rudolph during the Brutalism period in America. The building is located New Heaven, Connecticut. It is mostly masses of textured concrete with layers of steel-framed glazing. It was completed in 1963. Its main material is bush-hammered concrete. Smooth concrete and glass horizontal elements are supported by a sequence of towers that protrude above the roof in a series of turrets.
