- 1. Minutes from the February 1, 2022 meeting approved unanimously.
- 2. Discuss the results of the Faculty Technology Survey:
 - 53.16% (39.89% of full-time and 68.75% of part-time) faculty responses.
 - Good cross section of dept representation
 - Discussion of comparative analysis of data breakdown by school. And ways for analyzing free-text fields.
 - Overall, faculty largely felt like they were able to adapt to virtual teaching.
 - Overall, diminished student engagement and difficulty reaching students was a primary challenge.
 - Discussion of Respondus lock-down browser as an anti-cheating software that has an LTI integration with Blackboard-requested among a lot of faculty but is available for some programs (Nursing and Health Science).
 Committee will follow up with Rita Udin and Karen Lundstrum to find out more about availability of licenses.
 - Majority of faculty teach via zoom and synchronously.
