Vote on Proposal RES 03: Modify Eligibility Requirements for Independent Study, IS901 - change of the GPA eligibility requirement from 3.0 to 2.0; information added that students with GPA less than 3.0 (with special permission) who completed an independent study course did well; undergraduate students at City Tech conducting research in the Emerging Scholars program, open to students with a GPA of 2.0 to 4.0, demonstrated that, "participation is associated with higher GPAs in the semester of ES participation and in the several semesters after participation..." compared to a matched cohort not involved in research.
