1101 Intro: What are a resume and cover letter?!

<u>Résumé</u> = clear and concise summary of one's employment and education history, relevant experience and skills. Can submit to a potential employer, in application for a position.

<u>Cover letter</u> = letter to potential employer stating that you are applying for position, and enclosing your resume. It "covers" your resume!

A good resume:

- \triangleright is "positive" \rightarrow but **TRUTHFUL!**
- \triangleright is free from errors \rightarrow **PROOFREAD** it!
- is one page if possible!

Both subjects: Follow-up on ... U.S. (Federal) COURT SYSTEM!!

Highest appellate court = U.S. Supreme Court!! in Washington DC

- has appellate jurx over:
 - > all US Circuit Courts of Appeals
 - > highest state courts deciding federal questions

- original jurx over cases between 2+ states and "cases affecting Ambassadors, other public Ministers and Consuls"
- 9 justices; Chief Justice = John Roberts

Most cases reach (get decided by) the US Supreme Court through a request for a . . .

<u>Writ of certiorari</u> = a party <u>requests</u> US Supreme Court to <u>consider</u> its appeal of a Circuit Court's decision.

- If Supreme Court **grants** the writ, that means it <u>will consider</u> the appeal.
 - That is, it will decide whether the Circuit Court's decision was correct.
 - ➤ It does NOT mean the requesting party has won!!
 - ➤ The Supreme Court still needs to decide the case. *So the requesting party could still lose.*
- If Supreme Court <u>denies</u> the writ, that means it *will not consider* the appeal.
 - ➤ The Circuit Court's decision stands, as is. *It remains the law!*

1103 Civ Pro: Intro to the CPLR!!

"New York Civil Practice Law and Rules"

- A <u>statute!!</u> Enacted by NYS Legislature → The Law!!
- "User's manual" for civil cases in NY courts!
 - > Procedures, deadlines, documents to file, etc.
 - ➤ Learn to find your way around it!! *DON'T try to memorize*.

CPLR § 104. Construction.

The civil practice law and rules shall be **liberally construed** to secure the **just**, **speedy and inexpensive determination** of every civil judicial proceeding.
