1101: (Un)ethics: **UPL—*Sussman v. Grado!***

Unlawful practice of law (UPL) = conduct constituting the "practice of law" by an individual who is not a licensed attorney. *Prohibited* by NY Judiciary Law Article 15; *punishable* by civil and criminal penalties!! ☹

1103: Proprietor v. Consumer *continued*—**the complaint!**

CPLR Article 30's pleading requirements *for complaints and answers:*

- sufficiently particular to give notice (§ 3013)
- plain and concise statements (§ 3014)
- numbered paragraphs (§ 3014)
- one allegation per paragraph (§ 3014)
- causes of action separately stated & numbered (§ 3014)
- demand for relief (§ 3017)
- *for cases involving sale and delivery of goods* → also numbered list of items & prices (§ 3016(f))
