1101: (Un)ethics: UPL—Sussman v. Grado!

Unlawful practice of law (UPL) = conduct constituting the "practice of law" by an individual who is not a licensed attorney. Prohibited by NY Judiciary Law Article 15; punishable by civil and criminal penalties!! 😕

1103: Proprietor v. Consumer *continued*—the complaint!

<u>CPLR Article 30's</u> pleading requirements for complaints and answers:

- sufficiently particular to give notice (§ 3013) \triangleright
- AAA plain and concise statements (§ 3014)
- numbered paragraphs (§ 3014)
- one allegation per paragraph (§ 3014)
- causes of action separately stated & numbered (§ 3014)
- \triangleright demand for relief (§ 3017)
- for cases involving sale and delivery of goods \rightarrow also numbered list of items & prices (§ 3016(f))
