**Legal Research & Analysis follow-up!**

**Citation** = information indicating where a case, statute, constitution, or other law may be found.

**Citation of a court decision (case)** includes:

- name of the case (parties' names)
- volume number of the reporter in which it is located
- abbreviated name of the reporter in which it is located
- the year it was decided

**Example:** People v. Fiedler, 294 N.Y.S.2d 368 (4th Dep't 1968).

**Reporter** = set of hard copy books, in consecutively-numbered volumes, each containing published court decisions in chronological order.

**headnote** = short paragraph near the beginning of a court decision summarizing the court's ruling on a particular issue in that case.
