FALSE!! Individuals in the U.S. must obey laws created by the <u>federal government</u>, AND laws created by state and local governments. This is **FEDERALISM!!**

NYS UNIFIED COURT SYSTEM!

Trial courts (divided by Counties)

Statewide:

NYS Supreme Court (main trial court, 1 per county)

- general jurx (only court in NY that has it)
- > primarily handles:
 - o civil cases involving > \$25,000
 - o criminal felonies (in NYC only)
 - o divorce/marital cases

NYS Family Court (1 per county)

- adoption; foster care
- > juvenile delinquency
- Family violence; child abuse
- > child support, custody & visitation

NYS Surrogate's Court (1 per county)

- wills & estates (dead people)
- adoptions

NYS Court of Claims

exclusive jurx over \$ damages claims against NYS & related entities (e.g., CUNY)

Local trial courts in NYC (5 boroughs):

NYC Civil Court

- > civil cases up to \$25,000 in damages
- includes Small Claims Court (up to \$5,000)
- > includes Housing Court (landlord-tenant)

NYC Criminal Court

- misdemeanors and lesser offenses
- felony arraignments & preliminary hearings

Local trial courts outside NYC:

County Courts

- civil cases up to \$25,000
- all criminal trials (felony, misdem, etc.)
- appeals from City/Town/Village Cts in 3d & 4th Dep'ts only (upstate)

District Courts

- Nassau & Suffolk Counties (LI)
- > civil cases up to \$15,000
- riminal misdem & lesser offense trials; felony arraignments

City Courts

- > civil cases up to \$15,000; Small Claims & Housing
- riminal misdem & lesser offense trials; felony arraignments

Town & Village Courts

- > civil cases up to \$3,000; Small Claims & Housing
- criminal misdem's & lesser off's; felony arraignments

Intermediate appellate courts (divided into 4 Departments)

Supreme Court, Appellate Division (all 4 Dep'ts)

peals from (a) all statewide trial courts, (b) all Appellate Terms & (c) all County Courts

Supreme Court, Appellate Term (1st & 2d Dep'ts only)

- appeals from NYC Civil & Crim Cts
- appeals from District & City/Town/Vill Cts in 2d Dep't

Highest appellate court (only one!)

NYS Court of Appeals (Albany)

- > appeals from all intermediate appellate cts
- appeals directly from trial cts on NY constitutional issues
- decides certified questions from fed/other states' courts
- \triangleright 7 judges; Chief Judge \rightarrow ??

U.S. (Federal) COURT SYSTEM!!

Federal courts' jurisdiction \rightarrow 2 main types of cases:

(1) federal question jurisdiction

- involve federal laws
- e.g., whether an individual may enter the U.S., or whether the U.S. Constitution was violated

(2) <u>diversity jurisdiction</u> – must satisfy two criteria:

- dispute between citizens of different states (e.g., LeBron James v. Carmelo Anthony) AND
- amount in controversy = at least \$75,000

Trial courts (divided into 94 Districts)

- main trial courts = U.S. District Courts (94)
 - plus specialized courts (Bankruptcy, Tax, etc.—1 per Dist.)
- NY includes:
 - Eastern District of NY (EDNY) = Bklyn, Qns, SI, Long Isl.
 - Southern District of NY (SDNY) = Manh, Bx, Westchester
 - Northern District of NY (NDNY) = Albany, etc.
 - ➤ Western District of NY (WDNY) = Buffalo, etc.
- original jurx over civil & criminal cases, 1 judge

Intermediate appellate courts (divided into 13 Circuits)

- U.S. Circuit Courts of Appeals
- NY is in the Second Circuit.
- appellate jurx over fed trial courts (District, Bankruptcy, etc.)
- 3-judge panels

<u>Highest appellate court</u> = U.S. Supreme Court!!

- appellate jurx over:
 - ➤ all Circuit Courts of Appeals
 - highest state courts on federal questions
- original jurx over cases between 2+ states
- 9 justices; Chief Justice \rightarrow ??

<u>Writ of certiorari</u> = request to US Supreme Court to consider an appeal
