*Reading the court chart — in C+W p. 19!*

Follow the lines from bottom to top.

**Example 1.** A case may originate in the New York City Civil Court, Kings County. If there is an appealable issue, the case is appealed to the New York State Supreme Court, Appellate \_\_\_\_\_, \_\_\_\_\_ Department. Again, if there is an appealable issue, the matter may then be appealed to the New York State Supreme Court, Appellate \_\_\_\_\_, \_\_\_\_\_ Department. If there is yet another appeal, the case usually ends at \_\_\_\_\_.

**Example 2.** A case may originate in the Albany County Court. If there is an appealable issue, the case is appealed to the New York State Supreme Court, Appellate \_\_\_\_\_, \_\_\_\_\_ Department. If there is yet another appeal, and it will hear the case, the case usually ends at \_\_\_\_\_.

In both of these examples, if there is an issue arising under federal law, the matter is then submitted to the \_\_\_\_\_, which may or may not hear the appeal.
