**Service of papers** = delivery of legal papers / court documents to the person required to respond to them.

- > a/k/a "service of process"
- gives court <u>personal jurisdiction</u> over defendant/recipient
- governed by CPLR R. 2103

# CPLR R. 2103: Service of Papers!!

- (a) Who can <u>serve</u>:
  - (1) not a party
  - (2) 18+

## (b) & (c) $\rightarrow$ Who can be served, & how:

# (b) If the party has attorney, <u>must</u> serve attorney! Options:

- 1. Deliver personally
- 2. Mail
- 3. Leave at attorney's office
  - if open, with "person in charge" or in "conspicuous place"
  - if closed, in "letter drop"
- 4. Leave at attorney's residence
  - only if can't leave at office
  - with "person of suitable age & discretion"

- Fax (plus mail) Overnight delivery (FedEx) 6.
- 7. Email

# If party has no attorney, may serve <u>party</u> (her/himself). ➤ By 1, 2, 4, 5 or 6 above (under b) ➤ NOT 3 (leave at office) or 7 (email).
