CPLR R. 2103: Service of Papers!!

- (a) Who can <u>serve</u>:
 - (1) not a party
 - (2) 18+
- (b) & (c) \rightarrow Who can <u>be served</u>, & how:

(b) If party has an attorney, <u>shall serve attorney!</u> Options:

- 1. Deliver personally
- 2. Mail
- 3. Leave at attorney's office
 - ➢ if open, with "person in charge" or in "conspicuous place"
 - ➢ if closed, in "letter drop"
- 4. Leave at attorney's residence
 - <u>only</u> if can't leave at office
 - *with* "person of suitable age & discretion"
- 5. Fax (plus mail)
- 6. Overnight delivery (FedEx)
- 7. Email

(c) If party has no attorney, shall serve <u>party</u> (her/himself).

- ▶ By 1, 2, 4, 5 or 6 above (under b)
- NOT 3 (leave at office) or 7 (email).

CPLR § 308: Personal Service Upon a Natural Person

- 1. Personal delivery by hand, to the person
- 2. "Leave & mail" = (1) leave at job/home AND (2) mail
- 3. Personal delivery by hand, to the person's agent
- 5. As court directs when all else fails
