**Statutes of Limitations!!**

- Laws limiting time in which P may commence civil cause of action.
- Governed by CPLR Article 2
- **CRITICAL!!** *Follow the SOL, or your client will BE "S-O-L." ☹*

*Try it!!*

Your client had a bad date Friday night, and would like to sue her date for false imprisonment.

**What's the SOL?** (CPLR provision, and time limit) *CPLR § 215(3) → 1 year*

**What's the deadline to commence?** *May 10, 2020.*

Your client was hit by a car yesterday and wants to sue the driver for personal injuries.

**What's the SOL?** *CPLR § 214(5) → 3 yrs*

**What's the deadline to commence?** *May 12, 2022.*

Your client had surgery November 5, 2016. Today, she had an xray that showed that the surgeon left a scalpel inside her. She'd like to sue the surgeon for medical malpractice.

**What's the SOL?** *§ 214-a "foreign object rule" → 1 year from discovery of object*

**What's the deadline to commence?** *May 13, 2020*

**What if no foreign object was found?** *§ 214-a → 2 years 6 months → May 5, 2019 → She's S ☹ L!!!*
