<u>Case reporting system</u> = system by which court decisions <u>selected for publication</u> are organized.

**NOT all decisions are published!

- **YES** all U.S. Supreme Court and NY appellate court decisions are published.
- > **But NOT all** lower fed. courts, nor all NY trial court decisions, are published! *Only those selected*.
- "Reporters" = sets of books containing published court decisions.
- Also available online through electronic databases like WestLaw.
- "Unpublished" decisions also can be found on electronic databases, and on courts' websites!

Each reporter (set of books) contains decisions by *particular courts* (U.S. Supreme Court, N.Y. Court of Appeals, etc.).

- Most reporters are organized into several *series* (2d, 3d, etc.).
- Each series is organized into numbered *volumes* (books).
- Each volume is organized into *pages*.
- All of the above information is included in the *citation!*
- Decisions appear (generally) in chronological order!

Official Reporters = reporters published or approved by the government (state or federal). **Where possible, cite official reporters in documents submitted to courts in that jurisdiction!
