Small towns such as Columbus have many advantages. For example, friendly neighborhoods, community spirit and the lessened pressures of daily life. This is one of the residents built there in the early fifties for clients of simple taste. The house is modest, easy to maintain, and filled with light. Partitions which stop short of the ceiling reveal spaces less confining visually and physically. The unusual kitchen has a pivoting work counter to create different relationships between living, dining, and cooking areas. This design also uses free-form windows to articulate simple facades.
