Temperatures typically have an average of 50 degrees Fahrenheit at night in spring and summer months, with the day temperatures averaging at about 80 degrees

Due to the permanent snow covering on many mountains in Switzerland, the winter months are generally below freezing, averaging at 28 degrees Fahrenheit.
