Other than making learning more accessible to organizations, they are adding their own unique features and networking functions and combining everything together to create a better user experience. Also they are offer training services that follow their philosophy of keeping their solutions with existing technology. ### **Description of Position:**

But besides my unpreparedness in web design I have strong skills with the other requirements such as a design process and knowledge of the Adobe programs. In classes we are encouraged to develop this process as employers
