




Modest Muslim Women Deserve Accurate Representation

COMMON MISCONCEPTIONS

This statement is FALSE. Modesty is a personal choice, not oppression. It empowers women to take ownership of their bodies and challenge societal norms of objectification and beauty standards.




This assumption is FALSE. Muslim women have freedom of choice in their religion. Narrow-minded views on modesty undermine their ability to think and act independently.

Western media, political perception of the veil (or hijaab), and influential Western political leaders have been at the forefront of disapproval of Muslim women's modest attire. This has led to the rise of hate crimes, such as "incidences of abuse, both physical and verbal" against modest Muslim women as well as contributing to the rise of prejudice and fueling of Islamophobia.

Bring your attention to the difference in societal treatment by mainstream media when it comes to pop star Billie Eilish and Muslim women concerning their choice of modesty. Why is it that Billie Eilish is commended for her fashionably modest clothing, even recognized for being a "symbol of female empowerment" while Muslim women are labeled as backward or regressive for making the same choices? This double standard demonstrates society's praise for Eilish's modest choice of clothing while simultaneously devaluing Muslim women who choose to do the same.
