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The peer reviewing session we had in class felt like it was very helpful to me because it showed me the inadequacies in my paper and gave me a way to improve it. Things that I wouldn't have been able to catch myself were told to me by others and I can use their feedback to make a better paper. Things like expanding on some of the things I've seen and experienced for example was one of the recurring critiques. Also my paragraphs were short and could use some more info in them to make the paper longer. Peer review also showed me that there is some room for cutting information. I talked about how I can use my acquired internet literacy skills to change how I speak to different audiences but I didn't speak on how this has helped me in my academic life or even academics at all despite that being one of the major points of the assignment and I'll have to remove some of the paper to accommodate that. The last part about the peer reviewing session that I took away was that I get to see what works well with my audience and if not then I get to see how to make a more relatable paper that better resonates with them so that I bore no one with my writing about a topic that nobody has any care for
