**Directions:**

1. Peel “Technical Writing 101”
2. Peel “Too Big To Know”

8. Blend it with Weinberger’s argument that in today’s world “filters no longer filter out”; the exponential growth of information makes it impossible to filter out. You get a consistent flavor of today’s information world.
9. Pour the mixture into your open mind and you’ll released that a new idea has been created about information and knowledge and that “Technical Writing 101” by its self is obsolete; it needs the congruent idea of “Too Big To Know”.
