
In our design, we redesigned the trench coat completely changing materials, silhouette length, and changed it in almost every aspect to reintroduce these metals into the fashion atmosphere. I first began by making the material itself transparent, a trend that is upcoming on its own but I needed to hold the shape of the garment while still being protective and having less drape than the cotton twill. The plastic gives an openness about the dress which is a big concept when using modern metals. The metals themselves are thin pieces of stainless steel that are caught between the plastic of the dress popping the outside and the inside of the coat. This trench takes inspiration from Virgil Abloh's recent Louis Vuitton collaboration as she lengths the trench coat to drape to the floor and drag like a dress. This combined with the various chain mail dresses seen in fashion runways like in Salvatore Ferragamo Fall/ Winter 2021-2022 it inspired me to give the same beautiful drapery that metals can create.

The colors used are blacks, grays, and whites colors that are timeless, and to make a trend a long-time fashion statement we must make a timeless fashion style like a trench coat into a timeless garment. Using grays from the metallics that shimmer with a black tinted transparent

plastic and black catsuit and black tie-up heels it not only puts an exclamation point on the dress but it creates a mysterious and somber aura around it capturing the hardships that we may face this year covered with the shiny metals we're using to cover up the fear and sadness of being locked away from our loved ones.

The materials that would be used to make this dress would be stainless steel metal pieces. This is a more expensive and delicate piece but would scream to Millennials trying to look back and be nostalgic with the fashion. Polyurethane for the tinted plastic which is environmentally harmless will not damage any of the soil or animals even if the product is created by fossil fuels. Patent leather for the heels can be a more expensive commodity but is not far from what most millennials can afford in this day. One of the major political problems with the kind of garb meant today is what it does to the environment. These materials specifically polyurethane is made from fossil fuels which means that the damage caused to the environment is still there regardless if the end product is harmful to the environment if the process damages the earth it is all the same. It's a step in the right direction from using plastics but it doesn't solve the overall issue that fashion damages the earth and is a strong idea to move forward in fashion by

### **Proposed Silhouette**

The silhouette that we forecast in our designs for this project vary on different inspirations. The first translucent/transparent trench coat doesn't change much from the silhouette of our standard trench coat with single breasted design and large collar it gives a simple redesigned look for this upcoming 2023. This translucent trench can be described as an A line as it doesn't bother with the traditional belt and lets the material hold the trench up on its own, giving it a straight shape. The cropped and extra long sleeve trench coat or as we like to call it the mini trench takes from designs from Rick Owens Fall/Winter collection that shows jackets with asymmetrical sleeves, extra long sleeves and cropped silhouettes along with inspirations in Fendi, Acne Studios and many other companies that have been developing these styles this past year. This gives a broad arm and cropped silhouette that is almost reminiscent of women workers during WW2. The third and final silhouette is a more drastic one as using metals is only worth on such a drastic piece with an almost ballgown silhouette taking inspiration for Virgil Abloh's men collection and Dior's Oblique Trench Coat combined with modern metals to create it's entirely own new kind of Trench Coat one that can be durable yet elegant and shimmering into 2023.

The fabric swatches of this year take on what's already been used during 2021-2022 runways and modify it to give the designs new life. One of the most radical changes to the Trench Coat to keep it fresh and new is changing the material it is constructed from and changing it from cotton twill to Polyurethane which takes inspiration from Dior's Oblique Trench Coat which uses Polyurethane to be more eco-friendly and to give a translucent appearance while keeping it heavy and protective as trench coats were first functionally intended to be. The Cropped extra long sleeve trench coat design does change the material but keeps it true to the

original textiles while not being as long or protective this trench coat changed to be more of an accessory to the monochromatic outfit and give some flare and drape to the simple and body tight suit. The metallic Trench Coat gives us a completely new design with textiles like stainless steel and polyurethane combining two trends into one.
