## The First New Deal:

The first 100 days was actually called The First New Deal because Roosevelt took his first step in order to end the Great Depression. He told people to stop withdrawing money from banks and after 3 days, told them to put back whatever they'd saved during these days back to the banks. He enabled the Federal Government to build dams along Tennessee rivers to protect from flooding as well as gave payments to the farmers. The programs that he introduced on First New Deal were:



- The Agricultural Adjustment Act (AAA), improved agricultural prices by offering government aid to farmers to reduce production.
- The Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC), employed young boys and men at federal jobs on governed levels.
- The National Recovery Act (NRA), tried establishing industries that set prices and wages, as well as
  established the unionization.

#### The Second New Deal And WW2:

The Second New Deal was focused on economic recovery like I've said it before. It ensured public that they would be protected against unemployment and poverty. America entered WW2 and that's how WW2 helped the US to get out of that depression and as well as won the war. The New Deal brought many women into government forcemeat that they never expected. Women having their voices heard which happened just because of FDR. However, in other areas, women were unsuccessful. They were able to do men's jobs because at that time all men went to serve their country for WW2 and women were used to doing their Household and office working that's how They got independent. Further he presented more programs and they included:


**The Works Progress Administration** (WPA), giving millions of Americans jobs constructing bridges, pools, stadiums, roads, and such.

The Social Security Act(SSA) ensured unemployment insurance, aid to elderly and disabled. It provided health coverage and income assistance too poorly.

**The Agricultural Adjustment Act**(AAA) , helped to raise crop prices by lowering production. FDR also helped farmers and other workers through this Program.

## **Racism And Inequality In Employment:**
