In this mini-unit, you will be revising your education essay. The word "revise" literally means to "see anew," or to "re-see." In other words, you will be rethinking what you've already written in the hopes that you can:

- 1. Better fit it into our anthology of essays on education.
- 2. Direct it toward a particular audience, or discourse community. Who are you trying to talk to here? High school teachers? College professors? High school students? College students? Parents? Administrators? Politicians? What is the best way to reach that group? (In other words, not only what message do they need to hear, but what language best reaches them?)
- 3. Make sure you have a "so what?" to your essay. You don't want to leave your reader wondering, "why did I read this thing?"
- 4. Make any other changes you need to make as a writer to get your point across as well as possible.
