Current trends



Current trends have everything to do with what's going on in the world today also known as Zeitgeist of the times. Zeitgeist of the times has been changing throughout the years and decades which is natural and it will continue to change, evolve and develop through every stage in life because it depends on what's going on in the world and around us at that time.

Zeitgeist of the time is like the main vibe at a certain moment in time and the events that led to it. For example, what's been trending for the past couple of years has been directly affected by the pandemic in 2020 and the dramatic change that followed economically and globally. During the coronavirus pandemic, the whole world had to get used to all the media outlets called "the new normal" because when the pandemic hit we all were kind of forced to forget about the way we are used to living our daily life and adapt to a completely new way of living. Naturally That change eventually affected our dress and the way we view clothing. Societies around the whole world adapted this new more relaxed style.

People stayed in more and got comfortable style wise. They started wearing more slippers, sweatpants and biker shorts. Most of the clothes that were being bought were mostly comfortable loungewear and that's why comfortable clothing has been the trend ever since the pandemic hit.

History of skirts

Skirts are one of the most iconic and used clothing items. They have been present throughout all of history. In fact if you look at the history of skirts it dates back to 3,000 BC. (Martin, 2018, p.6) The skirt was one of the first clothing pieces to be invented, even before dresses so of course there has been many evolutions and history that comes with a clothing item being in history and relevant for these many years. When the skirt first got invented, it wasn't to be what it had become today, it was simply viewed as a piece of fabric that would cover the lower half of the body, the first skirt ever created was hand woven out of straw. (Morgan , 2021, p.2) Skirts go back centuries, back to ancient Egypt. Interestingly enough, in the beginning skirts were worn by men. (Patra, 2019, p.2) They weren't exactly designed the way we're used to seeing skirts with buttons, zippers etc. but they were a much more simple design that they wrapped around and tied at their waist and it looked like a kilt, it was called the Shendyt. These skirts were made from linen that was locally sourced from Egypt. (Patra, 2019, p.2)



The skirt evolved a lot throughout the years during the middle age, 19th century and the 20th century is when skirts became iconic. Throughout history women's clothing wasn't made to fit them nicely or show off their body but in the 1920s and 30s era the design of women's clothing started to completely change. From straight styles and bland to the waist being more cinched showing the figure better and that's where full skirts were also popular . The Victorian era was defined by dresses and super restrictive styles with the corsets and bustles. During that time era is where skirts also became popular again because women started to engage in more activities like riding a bike (Patra, 2019)

From 1886 skirts were less trimmed and their drapery placement changed. (Patra, 2019).

During the 20th century is when skirts really proved their presence and went through many alterations and evolving.

During that time skirts changed from different lengths and styles. In the beginning of the century, skirts started out being full length and by the end of the century there were many other styles and lengths introduced. Christian Dior who was a trusted fashion designer then introduced his new look which included that voluptuous long skirt look and revolutionized both skirts and fashion in the 20th century (Patra, 2019, p.6). Christian Dior was considered one of the most important couturiers after this collection (Charleston , 2004) His new look that he introduced consisted of a cinched waist, round shoulders and of course a very full skirt. After years of restrictive clothing and the military, dior celebrated femininity in women's fashion (Charleston , 2004) and that's why this collection was so significant and had a huge impact.



Skirts are the most versatile too. They can be dressed up with a pair of heels or be worn casually with a t- shirt and a pair of sneakers. They're not seasonal and can be worn during every season depending on how one styles them. We've witnessed the evolution of skirts throughout different styles and eras and they will still continuously evolve and change with every moment in time in history. The evolution of skirts had another groundbreaking change when Mary Quant, an influential fashion designer discovered a new look to skirts and invented the "mini skirt". When

Mary Quant invented the mini skirt, it was the most defining look of the 1960s and it was the center of attention during the swinging sixties. The swinging sixties was a revolution led by the youth in London in the 1960s. (Darcella, A. and Galopin, B. (2019)

Trend forecast




Color

Let's take a closer look at the colors trending this summer and how they compare to the color


