- The baby represents Jesus
- "The baby symbolizes luck and prosperity to whoever finds it. "
- In Mexican traditions, if you find the baby, on February the second you must make tamales and Atole !!



## Celebration!

In France, Kings day cake look like this ->

- In France you get a golden paper grown
- Instead of a baby, you get a mini king!
- Its also called " Galette des Rois"
- From the $14^{\text {th }}$ century, light fluffy puff pastry
- Filled with frangipane almond paste or apple.


Since Kings cake is a seasonal and temporary pastry item, it is not on menus, but it is on advertisement sheets like this one ->
