DEPORTATION DEFENSE

<u>Make the Road -</u> <u>Deportation Defense Manual</u>

This manual provides information about your rights when interacting with immigration enforcement, what you should do to prepare, and how to mobilize your community for support.





Legal Services NYC

Provides support in multiple areas in addition to immigration resources. All their services are free & open to anyone that lives in NYC. They have offices across all 5 of the NYC boroughs and can provide support in many different languages.

Legal Aid Society

Provides urgent immigration support to low-income undocumented folks. They also have legal aid support in other areas such as housing.

Immigration Equality

Provides direct legal aid support to LGBTQ+ asylum seekers. Immigration Equality's services are free regardless of your status. Red Cards - ILRC

The Immigrant Legal Resource Center (ILRC) created a series of cards in 14 languages to make sure people know their rights and can defend themselves in situations, such as when ICE agents go to a home. Go to the site to request cards or print your own.
