THE BASICS

- A SENTENCE'S <u>SUBJECT</u> AND <u>VERB</u> SHOULD AGREE
- A SINGULAR SUBJECT NEEDS A SINGULAR VERB
 - The bird sings sweetly all morning.
- A PLURAL SUBJECT NEEDS A PLURAL VERB
 - The birds sing sweetly all morning.
 - The bird and the bee sing sweetly.
- SO WHY IS IT COMPLICATED?

SOMETIMES INTERVENING WORDS MIGHT DISTRACT YOU

- AN INSERTED WORD OR PHRASE MAY DISTRACT YOU
 - My sister, rather than my brothers, buys me a sweater.
 - Several reasons for the earthquake are described.
- AN OF PHRASE MAY COME IN THE MIDDLE
 - One of my best friends is from Hawaii.
 - The point of all his complex arguments is that we should defend the rights of refugees.

SPECIAL CASE: THERE WAS, THERE WERE, THERE IS, THERE ARE

- IN THESE SENTENCE TYPES, THE SUBJECT COMES AFTER THE VERB (WAS/WERE/IS/ARE)
 - There is one way to reach the pizzeria from home.
 - There are two ways to reach the pizzeria from campus.

SPECIAL CASE: -ONE, -BODY, AND SINGULAR GROUPS

- ONE AND -BODY WORDS ARE SINGULAR
 - Somebody has left a book on the floor.
 - Everyone has gone to the library.
- SOME GROUP WORDS ARE SINGULAR
 - My family eats dinner together on Thursdays.
 - A million dollars was donated to the foundation.

SPECIAL CASE: *OR*, *NOR*, AND EXCEPTIONS

- WHEN OR OR NOR JOIN TWO SUBJECTS, THE SUBJECT NEARER TO THE VERB AGREES WITH IT
 - Neither the actors nor the director was satisfied with the scene. BUT Neither the director nor the actors were satisfied.
- BUT IF *NEITHER* OR *EITHER* <u>IS</u> THE SUBJECT, IT IS SINGULAR.
 - Of the two books, neither interests me.
 - Either is fine.
