Proposal

In 1904, the year New York City was introduced to the first subway by the IRT (Interborough Rapid Transit Company). Some would say that subways are the veins of New York City and trains have been helping New yorkers travel and commute for many years. New York City gets its uniqueness from all the people, cultures and classes that eventually meet and forms a melting pot in these subways. From news to fashion, dance, music, and poetry you can find all of this in our subway, but what draws the line between panhandling and entertainment? Could it be talent? Purpose perhaps? Or maybe the subject matter? By combining investigative research with a few interviews from local people, I will be creating a documentary about transit performers revealing a lifestyle that is constantly ignored, while answering questions like how and why many people decide to turn it.

For the past 4 years studying Entertainment Technology at New York City College of Technology; learning as well as practicing a variety of skill sets that can be applied in the workforce. I've focused on two elements of entertainment, Lighting and Video and want to specialize in these two tracks eventually mastering both fields. For this proposal I will be taking on the task of Cinematographer, Camera Operator, Writer, Director and Editor for a documentary which will include various interviews.As for the roll of the cinematographer, I will be providing a shot list/ shooting script and storyboard for this project.

Executive Summary

As the director I plan to travel with a small camera crew, somedays individually and capture footage necessary to answer my thesis, what makes people with such talent choose the subway for their platform? I will need to interview local performers as well as mta commuters, workers and even officers in order to communicate each perspectives. The challenges I expect to face will be recording the three different interview portion which will require multiple lighting setups and capturing footage for a shot list that will help the editing tell this story. For the outdoor interview the main lighting source will be naturally the sun. The two indoor shoots will also need to be lit different based on location where one interview will take place in a closed dimly lit space as for the second will be in an openly lit area with large windows. Although natural light is free and requires no power source, it is not easily controlled. Creating a balanced natural look that fits the cinematographer's vision is the main goal for a Lighting technician.
