Here is my write up for the grant:

TECHNE is the student led journal for the Department of Architectural Technology at the New York City College of Technology (Citytech). A student team of 6-8 students each year lead the development of the issue, including soliciting contributions, designing the layout, and managing the production. This journal provides a forum for the exploration of specific topics that are current issues within the department, in architectural education, and in the profession. The intent of the forum is to share ideas, encourage expression of diverse points of view on the topic, and foster growth of the intellectual and scholarly culture within the department. The inaugural issue of TECHNE in 2014 showcased the full range of student projects across our curriculum as a vehicle to summarize and communicate our department's identity and culture. The second issue focused on abstraction in architecture, the third on process, the fourth on design build. We issue TECHNE annually.

Previously we printed in May each year, but this year we are shifting our schedule to issue the journal in the fall to increase the journal's exposure to the college and professional community. We print 200-300 copies per issue through our copy center on campus. We are limited to the format and binding methods available at the center. Printed copies are distributed through the department office to students, faculty, staff, and visitors. Copies are also distributed through the Faculty Commons. All issues to date have also been posted online through ISSU: https://issuu.com/nycct_techne

There are three intended audiences for this journal. The first and most important is the department's community of students, faculty, and staff. Publishing the highest quality student work encourages a culture of continuous improvement and excellence. The faculty essays, interviews, and student reflections bring diverse points of view and ideas regarding architectural education and the the future of the profession to the department's community. The second audience is the college community, including the college administration, demonstrating the maturation of the students and department's creative and intellectual culture. The third intended audience is the architecture community of New York. Many professionals and educators in New York City are not aware of our architectural degree programs. This journal provides a vehicle for exposing our students' work to the New York City architectural community and improving their standing as they seek employment.

Citytech currently offers two degrees: The Bachelor of Technology in Architectural Technology (BTECH) and an Associate in Applied Science in Architectural Technology (AAS). In addition, the department is currently designated by the National Architectural Accreditation Board (NAAB) as eligible for candidacy for a Bachelor of Architecture degree (BARCH). The NAAB visiting team came to campus in February, and we expect to hear soon regarding moving on to the next step in the NAAB process to become a Candidate program. Our department's enrollment typically ranges from 700 to 800 students. We are an open enrollment program with a significant minority population, offering broad access to students who may not otherwise have access to higher education.
