Introduction

Since then the percentage of children in early childhood centers that are cared by someone other than their parents has risen. Most of the day young children spend their days with a nanny or at a day care which is becoming the norm since 1999. Center based programs such as early childhood centers provide different numbers of hours for care. Most parents work more hours than their child's school hours. Participation rates increases the income as well as parental education. Which, is aside from greater government support for programs targeting children with low income parents.

Method

Early childhood is viewed as a less educational consequence, which isn't true. The question of how these centers enhance their child's development is raised every day. The money for this project will go towards having an interest meeting/ event to give the parents in the community an opportunity to envision the upcoming school. The center will be a store front which limits the amount of kids, but also allow a greater connection between the teacher and child. Once the center is open, the next step is to paint and furnish the center with all supplies needed. A paint job is required all throughout the center with different vibrant colors. The money will also go toward any necessary internal work at the center. From buying changing tables, domestic play toys, manipulative toys, paint, chairs, and eating tables, to the simplest supplies like books for the kids to read. Opening a low budget day care center will require support from everyone in the community as well as funders. Not only will the youth receive the best education but the parents would not have to spend more than their pay check to enroll their child. With the low budget idea more parents will want to enroll their children and the center can become a brand. The center can then be built in all boroughs and maybe different states.

Proposed Budget

As a result of the limited of money, I will not be able to immediately open my center titled “Hazel’s Angels... Us against the world!” However, I will host an interest fair event where parents and their children can join me and some of the inspired teachers to learn more about the center. Before the event, \$1,000 will be given to the volunteers/ inspired teachers, which is \$100 per person for the entire event. These inspired teachers will have firsthand employment at the center. The event will be held for 3 hours in a Brooklyn location. The location itself is

located on Nostrand Ave. For the event the owner will charge \$800 for the 3 hours including chairs, bathroom, tables, and full access to the kitchen. With all that the venue offers, they will not decorate nor do they provide decorations. \$700 will be used on decorations, spending on not only small decorations that can paste to the walls but items that will be used for the activities during the event. Also, the venue however will not provide food, so for the guest; I would like to offer food. \$500 will be spent on food where Fried chicken, White rice, Fish balls, and 5 sodas, and 5 juices will be purchased from the Chinese Restaurant near the venue on Utica Ave.

Institutional Resources and commitments

Parents have concerns and may be unaware of the potential for their decisions about early care and education being what’s best for their child. Some have raised hopes that public support for early education might provide a means for improving the productivity of our educational system and reducing educational and social inequalities.

As far as financial budgeting each staff will be given two-week training before being hired. This training will conclude with a certification in Shaking Baby Syndrome as well as any other certifications needed to obtain a center. However, before hiring each employee needs to have their Department of Investigation and Education Fingerprints. Once the training is done each employee will be paid by the amount of kids enrolled. The ratio will be 5:1 for toddlers’ and 4:1 for infants. Which means for every teacher there are only 5 kids that teacher is allowed care for by themselves. Once the child is enrolled, the parent can either pay for the month or pay weekly, each parent gets three time pay lateness. After the third time the child will not be able to return to their class.
