Space, both positive and negative, defines the arrangement of elements within a design and influences the overall composition's balance and visual flow(Yalanska, 2022). By carefully considering the spatial relationships between objects, designers can create dynamic layouts that engage the viewer's eye. Moving on to value, this element refers to the lightness or darkness of colors within a design. The value helps designers create contrast, establish focal points, and add dimension to their compositions. Lastly, emphasis and contrast play a vital role in directing the viewer's attention and creating visual interest within a design. Through the strategic use of emphasis, designers can highlight key elements and create a hierarchy, guiding the viewer through the composition. Masterclass, Contrast, on the other hand, involves the juxtaposition of different elements such as color, size, or shape to create visual impact and enhance the overall clarity of a design. In essence, the eight elements of design form the foundation upon which all visual creations are built. By mastering these elements and understanding how they interact with one another, designers can craft compelling and impactful designs that resonate with their audience and effectively communicate their intended message.

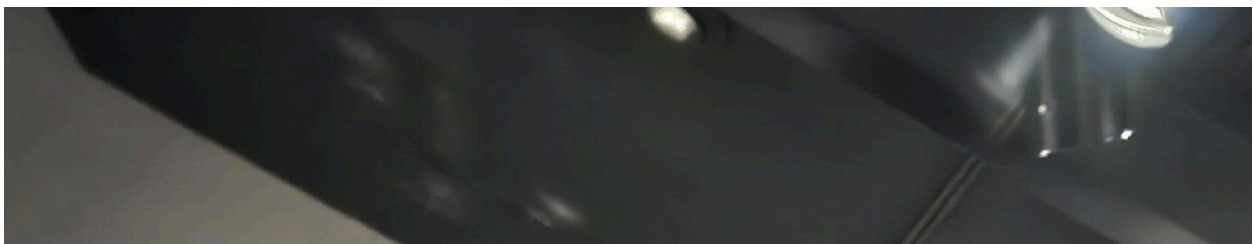
