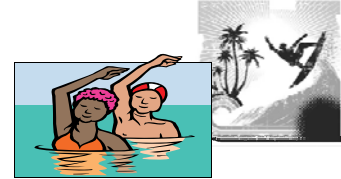

What is Site Planning?

- Understanding the site requirements of a desired use
- Understanding the best use for a given site
- Alteration of the environment to accommodate the desired use

Did we Site Plan at the beach?

- How is the choice of where to sit at the beach similar to the process of finding the best location for a building?
- How did we alter our environment at the beach to accommodate our desired use?
- Who provided the program?

What are the steps of site planning?

- **Site Inventory**
 - Gathering information, what is there?
 - Do not make assumptions as to use
- **Site Analysis**
 - Requires a defined use
 - Assets and Liabilities
- **Site Design**
 - Design solution to accommodate a specific use while making the most of Site Assets and minimizing Liabilities
