

# "research is the use of information to solve a problem"

(Badke, Ch. 2, p, 33)

"The key to genuine research is a good question. Without a question, nothing you are doing can be called research."

#### 1. Assess Your Needs

- First step: read the assignment thoroughly
  - —Why do you need the information?

- What kind of information do you need?
  - —Guides where to look for sources

# 2. Preliminary Research Strategies

- Gathering background information
  - Internet sources
  - Reference sources
  - We've been working on this in class

Why bother with background information?

## 3. Develop Your Topic and Question

 Research question is better than a thesis statement: why?

 NOT just reporting on a topic, but bringing multiple sources together and analyzing them to make new knowledge
