


SITE DOCUMENTATION








This picture was taken at Dean street as we can see, most of theses streets were not busy or crowed as other streets such as Fulton Street which is crowed all the time due to commercial stores.



KEYWORDS/VOCABULARY & DEFINITIONS

PARTY WALL: A wall common to two separate 2 buildings this wall are more commons in Brooklyn.

CORNICE: The molded and projecting horizontal member that crowns an architectural composition.

TENEMENT: A room or a set of rooms forming a separate residence within a house or block of apartments.

PORCH: A covered shelter projecting in front of the entrance of a building.

LINTEL: A horizontal support of stone or steel across the top of a door or window this is common on old buildings.
